Dear Parish Family,

As someone who has the joy of serving our parish in a leadership role, I wanted to take a moment to introduce myself and share a reflection with you. One of the great privileges of my work is witnessing, day after day, the generosity, faith, and quiet dedication of this parish family. I am grateful to walk alongside you and to serve a parish that so clearly desires to follow Christ.

One of the great joys of parish life is discovering that everything we have—our faith, our time, our abilities, and even our resources—is a gift from God. Stewardship begins with this simple truth: **what we have received in love, we are invited to return in love.**

Stewardship is more than financial support. It is a way of life rooted in gratitude. When we give back to God, we are not losing something—we are participating in what God is already doing. Generosity becomes a response to grace, not an obligation.

In our parish, we invite families to think about stewardship intentionally and prayerfully. A traditional Christian approach is to offer **10% of one's income back to God**. Many families choose to divide that gift in the following way:

- 4% to the parish**, supporting worship, formation, and daily ministry;
- 1% to the Diocesan God's Gift Appeal**, strengthening the wider Church;
- 5% to other ministries or apostolates**, serving the poor and advancing the mission beyond our parish walls.

This is not a rule, but a guide—an invitation to trust God and to grow in generosity over time.

Stewardship also extends beyond financial giving. I am deeply grateful to those among you who already give of your time, talent, and treasure, and who see firsthand how God is expanding the mission and footprint of our growing parish. Our parish depends on parishioners who offer themselves as volunteers, leaders, mentors, and servants.

On the back side of this insert, you will find information about parish funds, opportunities to serve, and simple steps for beginning a **regular stewardship gift**. Regular giving—weekly or monthly—helps sustain the mission of the parish and allows us to plan responsibly for the future.

Thank you for being part of this parish family. Your presence, your prayer, and your generosity—given freely and joyfully—help make this parish a place where faith is lived and shared.

CATECHESIS IN THE DOMESTIC CHURCH

Presentation of the Lord

Forty days after Christmas the Church celebrates the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple**, traditionally called **Candlemas**. This feast commemorates the day Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem, fulfilling the Jewish law of presentation and purification. There, the holy Simeon proclaimed the Christ Child to be “a light for revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of Your people Israel” (Lk 2: 29-32), a moment the Church has honored since the early centuries of Christian worship.

A traditional custom is the **blessing of candles**, which symbolize Christ as the *Light of the World*. Families are invited to bring candles from home to be blessed at our 7am and 12:10pm Masses on February 2!

This week, place a blessed candle in your prayer space or at your dinner table. Light it before family prayer and ponder Jesus who said “I am the Light of the World”. A few scripture passages that would be fitting to read and reflect on would be Luke 2: 22-38 or John 8:12.

May the light of Christ shine brightly in your hearts and homes!

HOSPITALITY & WELCOME TASK FORCE

Home is a place and a feeling, one that is warm, welcoming and inviting. I have heard more than once that many of our parishioners feel like our parish is their home. **It makes perfect sense as our original foundation was “A Family of Families”**. I have also heard from folks that we are “that big parish in South Fargo”. This is true as well.



It can be difficult to make a “big church” feel small. That is not my own experience. **I was welcomed into the choir before I was Catholic**. I was invited into the Church through the OCIA formation process. I have received the love and warmth from all of you in my permanent diaconate ordination. This movement is not unfamiliar to a family.

Taking time to invite and welcome is part of the initiative of the Parish Leadership Team and of our staff. But it wasn’t only those in church leadership who made the time for me, it was in fact a great many of you. McCHOIR'S MUSIC CORNER

Sanctifying the Secular

Hymns like “O God Beyond All Praising” are truthfully an insertion into the liturgy—appropriate of course for this purpose—and require discernment to determine their ‘fitness’ for being sung at Mass. Many a soul is stirred by the powerful melody and words that carry our praise in this hymn, but it may not always have been appropriate for use in the liturgy.

“O God Beyond All Praising” originates from an orchestral suite titled, “The Planets” by Gustav Holst which was premiered in 1917. His purpose in writing this was to create mood music to represent the ‘astrological character’ of various planets. In 1920, it was probably too soon to be using a secular melody like this for a sacred hymn, as the primary context people would have had to hearing it is external to the liturgy (i.e., the planet Jupiter, or simply an orchestral performance of classical music). So how does that context change? This is a great example of how “the liturgy of the Church presupposes, integrates and sanctifies elements from creation and human culture, conferring on them the dignity of signs of grace, of the new creation in Jesus Christ” (CCC 1149) Over time, we see certain things develop into a congruent relationship with the liturgy, where it can become a sign of God’s presence attuned to the spirit of the liturgy.

At present, there is not a particular law in the church for making this determination, so it falls to the bishops, priests and then directors of music—nervous gulp—to judge these things for worship. Easier said than done, and always worth our careful attention and effort.

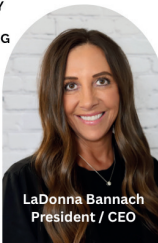

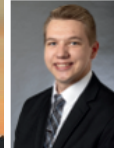
